**INCLUDED IN PRICE OF STANDARD PROGRAM:** Round trip airfare, transfers with group to/from airport; shared double room in moderate hotel; two meals daily; English speaking guide; transfer to and entrance fees for sites to be visited.

**NOT INCLUDED IN PRICE:** Tips of \$225 to be collected and distributed by tour operator; Single room charges (see below); Additions or changes to the standard program (see below); individual transfers; travel insurance; laundry, coffee and drinks; excess baggage and items of a personal nature; any increase in taxes and fees that may occur between the printing of this brochure and issuing of airline tickets. Price is based on the exchange rate at the time of printing and may be subject to change. Additional charge of \$190 for double and \$226 for single to pay by credit card.

**PAYMENT SCHEDULE:** Deposit of \$500 due with registration. Within 90 days of the departure date, space may be limited and/or a supplement in airfare may apply. Final payment is due December 4, 2017.

**TOUR DOCUMENTS:** The name on your airline ticket **must exactly match** your name as it appears on your passport. You must forward a copy of the photo/informational page of your passport within two weeks of enrollment on the tour. If applying for a new or renewed passport, send the copy as soon as you receive your new passport.

**SINGLE ROOMS:** Price is based on double occupancy. While Gomega Travel will try to match room mates, we cannot guarantee that a roommate will be available. If not, the payment of a single supplement will be required. When available, single rooms are often smaller than doubles. Single room supplement for this tour is \$800.

**ROOMMATES:** You will be charged for a single room if you do not have a roommate and/or Gomega Travel cannot match you with one.

**MEALS:** Buffet breakfast and set menu dinner daily. All other meals are "on your own".

**LUGGAGE:** Limit of one suitcase and one carry-on per person, not to exceed 50 pounds or 62 inches total.

**TRANSFERS:** Transport between airport, hotel and piers is included in the standard program. However, those who request changes from standard program are responsible for their own transfers.

## ITINERARY

**THURSDAY, MARCH 8** - Depart Houston Intercontinental Airport on United flight #5 at 8:20 pm.

**FRIDAY, MARCH 9 - Welcome to England.** On arrival at London airport meet with your driver and English speaking guide and depart for the city center.

Upon arrival enjoy a **panoramic tour of London**. The tour will commence in London's vibrant West End enjoy famous sights such as Buckingham Palace, Trafalgar Square, and Big Ben. We'll visit Westminster Abbey, an architectural masterpiece which has been the setting for every Coronation since 1066 and contains the tombs of many Kings and Queens. Also in the district of Westminster you will pass the Houses of Parliament. Then we'll move onto to the Old City of London. Although now largely commercial, the city is packed with history and noteworthy buildings. We'll see St Paul's Cathedral, designed by Sir Christopher Wren. You will pass the famous Hyde Park and Marble Arch. Then our final visit of the day will be at the Tower of London, ancient London's most historic monument and home to the priceless Crown Jewels.

This tour will also include **Bunhill Fields**, the site of graves of Susanna Wesley, John Bunyan, Daniel Defoe, Isaac Watts and others.

Visit **Wesley's House & Chapel**. Wesley's Chapel is a thriving Methodist congregation. The site consists of Georgian and Victorian buildings located in a fine Georgian courtyard near the financial district of London. John Wesley's chapel, his house and the Museum of Methodism are all on site. houses a conference center with meeting rooms available for hire.

Continue to your hotel and check in. Overnight, dinner, bed and breakfast at your hotel in London or area.

**SATURDAY, MARCH 10 - Sightseeing London.** Today spend a full day of sightseeing in London.

In the morning see the House of Parliament, the Tower of London and the Crown Jewels, the Buckingham Palace, The Mall and Trafalgar Square.

In the afternoon visit **St. Paul's Cathedral**. For more than one thousand four hundred years, a cathedral dedicated to St Paul has stood at the highest point in the City. Frequently at the centre of national events, traditions have been observed here and radical new ideas have found expression under the iconic dome. In many cases these events have left some physical record as well as echoes in the intangible memory of the building. The present Cathedral, the masterpiece of Britain's most famous architect Sir Christopher Wren, is at least the fourth to have stood on the site. It was built between 1675 and 1710, after its predecessor was destroyed in the Great Fire of London, and services began in 1697. This was the first cathedral to be built after the English Reformation in the sixteenth-century, when Henry VIII removed the Church of England from the jurisdiction of the Pope and the Crown took control of the life of the church. The three hundred year old building is therefore a relative newcomer to a site which has witnessed Christian Worship for over one thousand four hundred years.

Visit **Westminster Abbey**. Westminster Abbey is an architectural masterpiece which has been the setting for every Coronation since 1066 and contains the tombs of many Kings and Queens. Then we'll move onto to the Old City of London. Although now largely commercial, the city is packed with history and noteworthy buildings. We'll see St Paul's Cathedral, designed by Sir Christopher Wren. Then our final visit of the day will be at the Tower of London, ancient London's most historic monument and home to the priceless Crown Jewels. Built in the eleventh century by King Edward the Confessor, the abbey now houses the tombs of many royals from the subsequent centuries. The Wedding of Prince William and Kate Middleton took place here on 29th April 2012.

Overnight, dinner, bed and breakfast at your hotel in London or area.

**SUNDAY, MARCH 11 - London to Bristol.** Join **Sunday Worship and sing at John Wesley's Chapel**. After free time for lunch depart London and journey to Bristol. Continue to your hotel in Bristol and check in. Possible evening performance at Bristol Methodist Centre or similar.

Overnight, dinner, bed and breakfast at your hotel in Bristol or area.

**MONDAY, MARCH 12 - Bristol.** This morning visit **John Wesley's Chapel (the New Room)**. The New Room in Bristol is the oldest Methodist Chapel in the world (originally built in 1739). It was built and used by John Wesley and the early Methodists as a meeting and preaching place and was the centre for helping and educating the needy members of the community. The chapel itself is on the ground floor, upstairs there are the Preachers' Rooms. There is also a museum which contains a unique collection of papers and artifacts and tells the story of John and Charles Wesley and their life and work in Bristol.

Visit **Hanham Mount**. Hanham Mount is a historic site which is marked with a paved cross and symbolic illumination. A monument (bronze plaque) commemorates that this was where George Whitefield and John Wesley preached to the local mining community from 1739 which makes it one of their earliest open-air preaching places.

This afternoon visit **Wesley Centre at Kingswood School**. Kingswood School was founded by John Wesley in 1748. Originally in Bristol, it outgrew the original site and moved to its present location in Bath in 1852. The Wesley Centre traces the historical development of Kingswood School from its foundation in 1748 until today.

Continue to Bath and visit the **Pump Rooms & Roman Baths**. The Roman Baths complex is a site of historical interest in the **English** city of **Bath**. The house is a well-preserved **Roman** site for public bathing. The Roman Baths themselves are below the modern street level. There are four main features: the Sacred Spring, the Roman Temple, the Roman Bath House and the Museum holding finds from Roman Bath. The buildings above street level date from the 19th century. The Baths are a major tourist attraction and, together with the **Grand Pump Room**, receive more than one million visitors a year with 1,037,518 people during 2009. Visitors can see the Baths and Museum but cannot enter the water.

**Return to Bristol.** See the spectacular suspension bridge over the River Avon before returning to your hotel in Bristol. **\*Time permitting.** Overnight, dinner and breakfast at your hotel in Bristol or area.

**TUESDAY, MARCH 13 - York.** After breakfast depart Bristol for York. Upon arrival, enjoy a **walking tour of York**. York has been an incredibly important city in the North of England for over 2000 years. The modern city of York still showcases medieval walls, Viking findings and Roman ruins in its compact city centre. The delightfully cramped streets around The Shambles give you an idea of what life was like in medieval times and on your tour you will learn all about the city's long and fascinating history. There are many charming modern touches too with a huge selection of quaint cafés, boutique shops and traditional pubs throughout the city.

Continue to your hotel in York and check in. Overnight, dinner, bed and breakfast at your hotel in York or area.

**WEDNESDAY, MARCH 14 - Stratford-upon Avon via Epworth.** Upon arrival in Epworth, visit the **Old Rectory**. A visit to the Old Rectory built in Queen Anne style in 1709, will transport you back to life in the early 18th century and introduce you to the remarkable family who lived there. It is the home of Samuel Wesley and his wife Susanna who brought up their sons, John and Charles Wesley, who went on to develop the Methodist movement, with their seven sisters and elder brother Samuel. See how the Wesley family lived and learn about the history of 18th century England and the influence the Wesleys had on it.

Visit the **Memorial Church in Epworth**. Wesley Memorial Methodist Church is an inspiring reminder of the achievements of John and Charles Wesley. See the unique chancel window where

three colourful panels illustrate the story of Christ and his disciples. Above the panels you can find a portrait of John and his hymn-writing brother Charles, both facing towards their childhood home, the Old Rectory. Encircling the portrait you can read John's famous words: "the best of all is "God is with us".

Continue Stratford via Lincoln where Wesley's father was imprisoned. Upon arrival in Stratford, check in at your hotel. Overnight, dinner, bed and breakfast at your hotel in Stratford-upon-Avon or area.

**THURSDAY, MARCH 15 – Stratford-upon-Avon.** This morning visit Shakespeare's Birthplace. Shakespeare's Birthplace has been welcoming visitors for over 250 years. This is the house where William Shakespeare was born, grew up and played. He ate meals in the hall and he slept and dreamt in these rooms. Shakespeare also spent the first five years of married life in this house with his new wife, Anne Hathaway. For millions of Shakespeare enthusiasts worldwide, this house is a shrine. Here you will discover the world that shaped the man and find out what other famous writers thought when they visited here. Follow in the footsteps of not only Shakespeare, but other well-known visitors such as Charles Dickens, John Keats, Walter Scott and Thomas Hardy.

Then visit **Ann Hathaway's Cottage**. Discover where the young William Shakespeare courted his future bride Anne Hathaway at her picturesque family home. Enjoy beautiful gardens in Stratford upon Avon. Anne Hathaway's Cottage is a thatched farmhouse with stunning grounds and gardens, which overflow with fragrant blooms and traditional shrubs. The cottage is in Shottery, a hamlet within the parish of Stratford-upon-Avon. It is just over one mile from the town centre and can be accessed via a pleasant, well sign-posted footpath. See for yourself the many original items of family furniture, including the Hathaway Bed, dating from Anne's time and take in the beauty and tranquility of the charming cottage gardens.

Visit the **Holy Trinity Church**. Holy Trinity Church is one of England's most beautiful parish churches. It is the church where William Shakespeare was baptised, where he worshipped and where he is buried.

Visit the **Bishop Asbury Cottage**. This small, mid-18th century cottage, presented with period furnishings, is the boyhood home of Francis Asbury. Asbury became the founding father of Methodism in America and was ordained as its first bishop.

Tonight enjoy an evening performance at the Royal Shakespeare Company Theatre. (tickets not included – we can get the group rate and let you know what the price will be and let people sign up ahead of time). Overnight, dinner, bed and breakfast at your hotel in Stratford-upon-Avon or area.

**FRIDAY, MARCH 16 - Oxford.** In the early morning leave Stratford to Oxford. Enjoy a **walking tour of Christchurch College**. Christ Church is one of the largest colleges in the University of Oxford and the Cathedral Church for the Diocese of Oxford. Christ Church has a fascinating history and many distinguished people have studied here including John Wesley, John Locke, Robert Hooke, Robert Peel, William Gladstone, W.H. Auden, David Dimbleby, Rowan Williams, Richard Curtis and Howard Goodall.

**\*Oxford University's Lincoln College does not offer visits for large groups. If only 10-15 confirm then we may be able to offer this option at a supplement.** Possible performance in Oxford.

Visit **The Church of St. James The Great, South Leigh**. The Jacobean pulpit is where John Wesley preached his first sermon in 1725 at the invitation of rector Stanton Harcourt. He returned to South Leigh to preach again in 1771 but was not allowed in the church. Alternatively, you could enjoy free time in Oxford.

Continue to London and check in at your hotel. Farewell dinner at your hotel. Overnight, dinner, bed and breakfast at your hotel in London or area.

**SATURDAY, MARCH 17 - Farewell.** After you have enjoyed a final breakfast you will be transferred to the Airport for your return flight home.
